NAPLAN 2021

Our school continues to make steady gain in our NAPLAN results. We are continuing to perform at a higher level than schools that are similar to Dryandra Primary. In fact, we were higher than our 'like schools' in all five testing areas for both Year 3 and Year 5.

In the chart below, we performed better than expected. This is represented on the chart in green. The results in 'yellow' indicate that we performed as expected. If we performed below expectation, then you would see 'red' boxes. You can see that we have not achieved any red boxes. This is a wonderful result for our school and students. It highlights that the programs that we are implementing are having a positive impact and that our students are continuing to consolidate their learning.
